Services

As an educator, it can be challenging to respond to every question that arises in the classroom about **past injustices.** Subjects like the Holocaust are often taught using basic information such as the dates, places and names of those involved. However, there is more to history than what, who and when – there is also *why*.

Conversation Builds Character is a nonprofit organization that provides a variety of services to help teachers, school administrators and community leaders facilitate difficult conversations about past atrocities. We provide educators with tools and knowledge to create deeper discussions of the behavioral conditions that lead to intolerance. We help educators guide students not in what to think, but in what to think *about*.

Our goal is to help challenge students to examine their thoughts, speech, actions and non-actions in light of these past behaviors, in order to teach them to *think* critically, *act* responsibly and *lead* courageously in the present.

Workshops

Our main service is a workshop titled "Holocaust 360: A Modern-Day Conversation on Human Behavior." One of the most effective subjects we have for examining basic moral issues is the Holocaust. So by using the Holocaust as a lens to explore how human behavior and societal conditions can lead to such atrocities, students are encouraged to reflect on their own behaviors and communities to identify how their actions and non-actions affect the world around them.

This three-day workshop is offered twice a year. Using resources that will complement your school's existing curriculum, participants will learn how to use restorative circles to create a non-judgmental environment, allowing you to promote personal reflection and foster mutual respect through the conversations in your classrooms.
